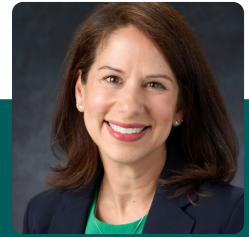
Today, we remain unwavering in our commitment to safety and healing, offering:

Sexual Assault Program: Expanding Operations & Community Support

At LiveSafe Resources, we are driven to provide our clients with resources and support to help them thrive. Through our Sexual Assault program, we provide victims of sexual assault with forensic medical examinations, accompaniment, change of clothes, advocacy, referrals, and follow-up wrap-around services in a setting that sets the statewide standard for a trauma-informed response.

We are committed to collaborating with other organizations to provide superior services and programs. In 2024, the Cobb County District Attorney's office supported our expansion of clinic operations. With their help, we purchased a new hospital bed designed to assist patients with mobility issues for our second exam room and added an additional Cortexflo camera. As the average exam takes 4 hours, these new resources are crucial for promptly serving clients.

Additionally, we increased our staff by hiring a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Program Manager, a part-time staff nurse, and three Sexual Assault Advocate positions. Alongside our eight contract SANE nurses, these positions help us ensure 24/7 coverage for any sexual assault crisis response in Cherokee, Cobb, or Paulding Counties, whether delivered in hospitals or our dedicated SANE suite.

Providing a Safe Path for Success

In 2024, we served 187 victims of sexual assault forensic exams, safety planning, counseling, and client-centered advocacy to help them heal and stay safe.

As we embark on 2025, our focus includes increasing training and educational opportunities in partnership with Cobb County Family Advocacy Center for public safety and community partners to identify victims of non-fatal strangulation. Through our community partnership, we will be able to grow our sexual assault team capacity to increase access to non-fatal strangulation forensic exams.



Nearly **1 in 5 women** have been **raped** and **almost ½** of all women have experienced another type of sexual assault.

Counseling & Staff Resiliency: Increased Support for Our Clients & Staff

As the state certified provider of domestic violence and sexual assault services serving Cobb, Cherokee, and Paulding Counties, LiveSafe Resources' free counseling services support victims and survivors, regardless of when the event(s) occurred. Our licensed counselors and trained counseling interns help clients move through crisis toward healing through a solution-focused, trauma-informed counseling approach.

The rising demand for all LSR services has led to a 30% increase in the additional caseload for our core direct service team. Our small counseling team works hard to provide the best care and insight, but the demand for services continues to outpace the available hours in a day. Critical funding will allow the strategic growth of our counseling services to support the mental health of our clients and staff.

Expanded Availability of Client Services

Expanding our mental health services fills a significant gap in our community of survivors and their families. Our counseling leadership

team continues to expand therapeutic partners to increase access to bilingual counseling, child therapy, and specialty group support. Intentional growth will support the following efforts:

- **4 certified counselors** to provide **5,000+** counseling sessions annually and increase group therapy
- **12 sessions** for each client, increasing our capacity to support **400+ additional clients** in sexual assault and domestic violence specialized counseling
- Supervised interns to help increase the availability of client sessions

Staff Wellness and Self Care

Our staff is operating at full capacity to serve the needs of others, and therefore they also need support to reduce stress and prevent burnout. A priority in 2025 is to provide and establish an in-office resiliency room equipped with calming techniques and resources for staff to utilize when at work. Recent studies have found that these rooms significantly reduce stress levels among healthcare workers in high-stress environments. The room would be available to direct service staff before, during, and after shifts.



In 2024, we **served 3,652** unduplicated clients, **406 more** than in 2023.

Refreshing & Revitalizing Our Safe Spaces

The LiveSafe Resources transitional housing program assists survivors with finding a stable living environment. Our 12-unit apartment facility is a single building that can accommodate up to 39 people and includes a common area within a community support model. This location provides an apartment-living feeling while being highly secure, with multiple layers of safety mechanisms to prevent access by abusers or stalkers.

Clients can remain in the transitional housing program for up to two years, although the median stay is typically 10-15 months. To promote self-sufficiency and independence, clients pay a fee of up to 30% of their gross-adjusted income instead of paying rent and utilities.

In addition to providing a stable and safe home environment, our transitional housing program provides clients with the following benefits:

- Safety planning, including a living document that can be revisited as situations change (e.g., the perpetrator is released from jail, the client moves to a new residence, etc.)
- Skills and asset building needed to live independently, away from abuse
- Childcare, health care, transportation, education, and employment assistance as they work toward fully independent living

- Short—and long-term plans for self-sufficiency, such as savings accounts, business ownership, education and insurance
- Help moving into permanent housing once they are emotionally ready, their family finances are stable, and they have attained or are on the path to attaining their individual goals for personal assets
- Eligibility for a financial empowerment opportunity with more intensive budgeting, debt reduction efforts, and a \$2,000 deposit in their savings account

Refreshing Our Safe & Meaningful Space

Given the high utilization of the apartments over the past decade, our transitional housing space experienced considerable wear and tear than regular apartments. Since opening in 2013, we have housed over 450 clients, with an average occupancy length of 14 months.

Everyone deserves access to quality housing options, and additional funding will help provide new furniture in the refreshed apartments, truly revitalizing these homes and uplifting the families living in them.

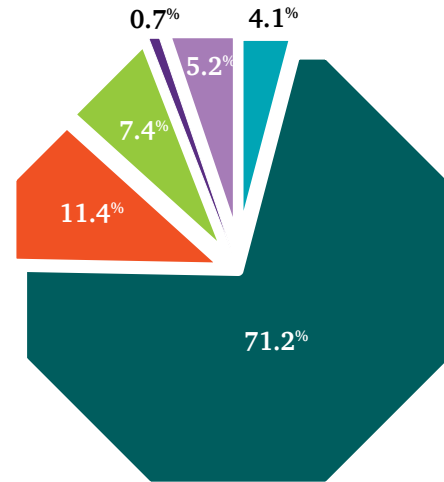

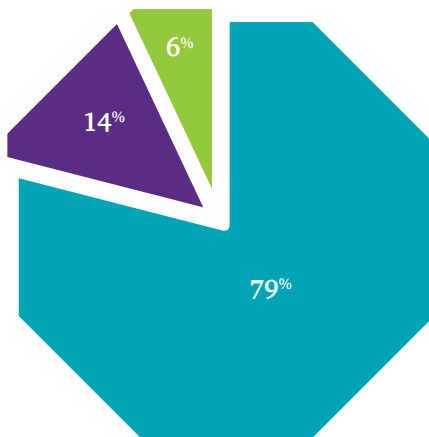
